## Letter from the Vicarage

The Church's Darkest Secret was a documentary aired on BBC2 in January, looking at the Church's handling of the circle of abuse surrounding Bishop Peter Ball. What made it shocking, even for someone like me who had read all the reports, was hearing the abused speaking in their own words and, with great dignity and courage, telling a story I could recognise, even if I had been blind to it before. It left me heartbroken for the victims and (for the first time) ashamed of the Church. The story of young Christians, eager to follow God more deeply, who had entrusted their lives to the Church only to find abuse and cover-up, could have been the story of any of us who have trusted our lives to the Church. In fairness, the experience of most of us (me included) has been that the Church is the most inspiring, compassionate and caring institution we have ever encountered. But for a precious few, the experience was chillingly different.

It is a difficult issue to face, but Lent is a time for self-examination and repentance, facing the difficult, dark places in our own selves. That applies to an institution like the Church as much as it does to individuals. Indeed, for me, one of the bewildering questions is how the Church, which stands for self-examination, honest confession and repentance, could hide in the darkness and side with the abuser rather than the abused, whom Jesus calls us to love and serve? More importantly how can we change now?

Hearing victims' stories has made me realise that, although the Church has improved its safeguarding systems massively since Peter Ball, there is still a problem at community level, which goes far beyond the Church. Ours is a culture that tends to disbelieve shocking claims, especially when the accuser is a broken mess and the accused is plausible and popular. There is a (perfectly proper) concern for the wrongly accused which makes us anxious about the consequences of reporting abuse. But perhaps the biggest problem is the one we least recognise - the tendency for groups of people to collude with bullying, manipulative and overbearing behaviour, which is almost always how abusers cover their tracks. "For evil to triumph only requires good people to do nothing." And nothing is precisely the response we too often offer when we encounter bullying, manipulative or overbearing behaviour within a community or group. But a person who behaves like that in public, often behaves like that in private too. Not all of them will be abusers, but it is still a part of the problem. Not challenging it erodes the safety of the community and can create a smokescreen to allow abuse, domestic violence and undue influence to go on in full view, yet apparently unnoticed.

So how can we become a safer community without witch-hunt or hysteria? Firstly, become more aware of the signs of abuse or domestic violence. There is lots of good advice on websites such as Victim Support or the NSPCC on what to look out for and how to respond. Secondly, if someone reports abuse to you, don't ignore it. Don't judge it for yourself, either way, but pass it on to Social Services to investigate properly. Thirdly, if you are a victim yourself, get support. You are not supposed to carry this alone. That's just what abusers want you to think, but it is not so. Perhaps above all, though, we can call out bullying, coercive or overbearing behaviour. Take note when someone consistently makes us feel anxious, belittled, afraid or uncomfortable, particularly if we find we are not alone in our concerns. Naming and challenging unacceptable behaviour together, even in people who are charismatic and charming, brings the behaviour out of the shadows into the light. That can create safe boundaries to help the abuser and the abused, and contribute to a fairer, safer community. Stewart

#### **Morland Parish Council News**

#### **Neighbourhood Development Plan**

Cllr L Robson reported that the suite of documents have undergone a further presubmission scrutiny by Eden District Council. There are a number of amendments which will be made before re-submission.

#### The Crown Inn

Clerk A Runkee reported that application for the Crown Inn to be re-registered as a community asset had been submitted to Eden District Council. The nomination will be considered by the Executive meeting on Tuesday 25 February. A copy of the report will be presented the parish council in due course.

#### **No Cold Calling signs**

A request was made that the Parish Council look into signage declaring Morland as a No Cold Calling village. This was discussed and decided that at the present moment no further action will be taken.

#### Halmshaw's Garage

The site is unsightly and is frequently vandalised. Eden District Council have undertaken a review of the site in the past and stated that no action could be taken as the site did not contravene any regulations. The parish council are wating for the Environmental Team to re-visit the site.

#### **Parking**

A letter of concern was sent to the Parish Council regarding the issues caused by vehicles dropping off and picking up pupils from the school, especially if there is an event taking place in the village hall at the same time. Cumbria County Council's response would be to implement a no parking zone, which at present, is felt should be avoided if softer measures can be taken at a local level. The issue is ongoing.

#### **Glenton Vale**

The footpath and bridge are being eroded away by the river. The landowner has been informed by the Environment Agency that he cannot take any action and the river should be allowed to set its course. Morland Parish Council are writing an all agency letter expressing their concerns regarding the erosion of the footpath, the bridge, the ford and the roadway and the fact that the landowner has been prevented from resolving the issue.

#### **DOG FOULING ON THE PLAYING FIELD**

The Parish Council have received complaints and have witnessed first-hand numerous occasions of dog faeces on the playing field. Please can we remind all dog owners that the playing field is for children and they should never come into contact with dog poo so please do the right and the nice thing for everyone in the village and pick it up and take it home.





- Make sure you get enough calcium and vitamin D to keep bones strong.
- Check your homes for trip hazards. Some risks are obvious, but often overlooked, such as clutter or poor lighting.





#### Oral history volunteers to record our commoning heritage






