From the Vicarage

Uncertainty is a characteristic of modern life. General elections, Brexit, zero-hours contracts, among other things, have added uncertainty to our lives for some time, but surely the scale of uncertainty at the moment is something we have not faced for a generation or two. I anticipated that our first printed edition of this newsletter since lockdown would herald a return to normality, but this is nothing like normality. Indeed, it is only reasonable to wonder whether the pre-lockdown normality will ever return.

Uncertainty fuels anxiety and anxiety can lead to fear and fear is not a good motivator for human beings. Perhaps that is why the most common command in the Bible is "Do not be afraid." But how do you stave off fear when everything is uncertain?

Well, if you take a longer view, uncertainty has, in fact, been normality for most of human history. The recent relative predictability of life was probably dependent on a model of industrialisation and consumption that was unsustainable in any event. Uncertainty was certainly the norm at the time of Jesus' earthly life and he spoke about it when he said, "Do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?" (Matthew 6:25-26). They're wise words and help to put out troubles into perspective, but he has an even more important response to uncertainty and anxiety when he adds, "strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all the other things you need will be given to you."

Striving for the kingdom of God is probably not something that occurs to many of us these days in any situation, and may be the last thing on your mind if you're facing uncertainty. What does it even mean? Well, the kingdom of God is God's rule in creation. It's what the creation looks like when the creator is back in charge and we live life the way he intended, not because we have to, but because we want to. Jesus' whole life was a demonstration of what the kingdom looks like – justice is done, the hungry are fed, the sick are healed, the dead are raised, people are forgiven, the prisoners (of body, mind and spirit) are freed and relationships are restored. Living in that kingdom is the hope that underpins the Christian faith. So how do we strive for it?

Firstly, by wanting it. The kingdom of God only becomes a reality when we long for it from our own freewill, so adjusting our priorities is the starting point. Uncertainty is a good time to ask "what really matters?" Secondly, it should be clear to any casual observer, that the kingdom of God looks very different from the world as it is. Returning to normality is not going to lead us to God's kingdom. We need to change (quite a lot!) So striving for God's kingdom helps us to see uncertainty more positively, as a chance to change. Thirdly, we strive for it by being thankful for God's gifts, trusting his provision and committing ourselves to live the life of his kingdom. That relieves us of the need to feather our own nest (the cause of so much anxiety) and liberates us to work for justice, to feed the hungry, heal the sick, set the prisoners free and restore relationships – and yes, even to be raised beyond death! In doing that, we find that God will give us everything we truly need, without all the anxiety.

The Morland Neighbourhood Plan

An update

The Parish council decided to develop a Neighbourhood Plan with a view to protecting and enhancing our village, in particular, the heart of the village.

A group was established comprising five volunteer villagers and two parish councillors, with support from our clerk. Following meetings with our plan author and undertaking tasks he suggested, we went on to consult with villagers and then to commissioning a Heritage Report that helped us to appreciate the development of the village, it's quirks and charm. The plan's aim is to protect from insensitive development and to enhance and maintain our lovely surroundings.

To date, most of the plan is done (subject to further scrutiny!) and the focus is on the central village area. The final area of concern for us is the field in the heart of the village. We are asking villagers to respond to a short survey to support (or not) our wish to seek long term protection for the field. We feel the field and the open views it allows and its historical and current role as agricultural land is integral to the heart of the village. So, along with our past consultations, we would ask you all again to give some time to this and share your views.

We shall report back on the survey before Christmas and look ahead to the next steps the Neighbourhood plan has to take to reach completion.

The Parish Council and the Neighbourhood Planning group all thank you for your time and interest.





Take Positive Steps to Avoid Trips and Falls

People of all ages fall. However, the consequences of falling for older people can be serious. Falling due to aging is not inevitable, there are simple things we can do to minimize risk.

- Get regular exercise to improve strength, fitness and balance.
- Have your eyes and hearing checked. Vision and hearing play a vital role in balance and movement.
- Ask your pharmacist or GP for an annual medication review.
 Some medicines or illnesses, such as poorly controlled diabetes, can make you feel faint or dizzy.
- Look after your feet. Painful feet and ill-fitting shoes can affect your balance and increase the risk of falling.
- Make sure you get enough calcium and vitamin D to keep bones strong.
- Check your homes for trip hazards. Some risks are obvious, but often overlooked, such as clutter or poor lighting.

Making small adjustments in your daily life doesn't mean that you have to limit your activities. In fact, it can give you greater freedom and confidence.

If you do have a fall or feel at risk of one, tell your GP






