### From the Vicarage

New life is something that we are all hoping for at the moment. For most of us, our ambitions are modest. I want to be able to sit drinking beer with friends, talking the sun down the sky. I want to have my hair cut! I want to be able to help folk without keeping my distance and wearing PPE. I suppose, as I reflect back, I simply didn't appreciate those things enough in those days when I took them for granted. I hope I will never take them for granted again. Life is an incredible gift, but it is so easy to miss it. It gets buried under the daily routine, lost in the mad rush of work, wasted away in pointless activity. A gift only really comes alive when you treasure it and make the most of it.

Easter is, of course, a time of new life. And if my ambitions for post-lockdown are modest, largely based on going back to the way things were, God's ambitions for us at Easter are lavish and spectacular. It is nothing less than eternal life. What he offers is not mere endlessness (which would be rather terrible, I think), or a 'get out of jail free card' to cheat death. It is an invitation to change utterly, to grab hold of life in all its fullness and live in such a way that we'll never want to go back to the way things were.

Easter is an offer of life that is unearned and pretty much undeserved. Despite all that we've done to our planet, to one another, to ourselves and to our creator, he offers to take all those consequences upon himself and start again, deeply and fundamentally, as a new creation. But is that what we want? It's an important question, not least because God asks it of us, and he will take our answer seriously. There is an episode in the Gospels where Jesus comes across a disabled man sitting by the pool and he asks him "what do you want me to do for you?" They both know Jesus could heal him, but the man wavers – does he really want to be well again and have to take full responsibility for life? Jesus heals him anyway, but we are left wondering if he is really going to embrace the new life he's been given. In a way, that man is you and me.

Emerging from lockdown is something I'm longing for and fearful of at the same time. I've lost confidence in social situations, I've become fearful of spreading the virus. I've got used to not having to make the effort to go out and be with folk. I know none of that is good for me, that I'm not living life as it should be lived, but part of me wants to cling on to this dull half-life. And eternal life carries even more implications. The whole reason Jesus offers his life in exchange for ours is to have a relationship with us, to live in daily companionship with us and teach us the true meaning of love once more. But that requires time, it asks us to give up our own comfort to invest in a whole series of relationships, with our neighbours, our families, the wider world, the planet itself and with God. It requires us to lay aside our own ambitions and priorities to live life differently. Do we really want that? Yet it is the only way to live. At the end of the day, the meaning of life is very simple – it is love. And love is only found in its truest form in God, the creator who gives us life, who picks up our mess when we throw that life away, who climbs into our mess to suffer it all with us, who puts his own needs aside to serve us and who still loves us enough to give his own life for us so that we might live. And in inviting us to live, he is inviting us also to love": to learn to serve, to be willing to suffer, to spend our lives in caring – just as he did. For caring is love and love is life, eternal life. Is that what we really want? How will we answer God's question "What do you want me to do for you?" May new life be yours this Easter and al-Stewart ways.

My Dear Friends, A very *Happy and Blessed Easter* to you and your families. It gives me immense pleasure to greet you once again at this joyful time. Easter is one of my favourite seasons because it is that special time of the year when I join Christians around the world in singing, "He arose! He arose! Hallelujah! Christ arose!"

This Lenten season has been so different from all that we are accustomed to, as restrictions are still in place to reduce the spread of the Coronavirus. We have not been able to gather in large groups physically for prayer and fellowship in Church, and we do miss the togetherness and the laughter. It is knowing that the joy of His presence inspires us at each stage of our journey; each part of the journey is unique and radiates the Light of Christ. Mother Patsy reminded me that our MU busyness continues until we reach this stage in life, when the spirituality that underpins our work, becomes even more central to our lives, drawing us closer in our relationship with God. Whatever we are faced with, we are committed to lifting up all members in prayer, especially those who grieve the loss of loved ones, and face conflict and hunger in their communities each day. We thank God that in all situations his Grace is sufficient.

As we continue to find new ways to stay connected with each other, I would like to encourage you to join me this Easter in creating a quiet space, where you and a friend or two, can lose yourselves in God's presence with this prayer from the Diocese of Newcastle.

#### Take Positive Steps to Avoid Trips and Falls

People of all ages fall. However, the consequences of falling for older people can be serious. Falling due to aging is not inevitable, there are simple things we can do to minimize risk.

- Get regular exercise to improve strength, fitness and balance.
- Have your eyes and hearing checked. Vision and hearing play a vital role in balance and movement.
- Ask your pharmacist or GP for an annual medication review.
   Some medicines or illnesses, such as poorly controlled diabetes, can make you feel faint or dizzy.
- Look after your feet. Painful feet and ill-fitting shoes can affect your balance and increase the risk of falling.
- Make sure you get enough calcium and vitamin D to keep bones strong.
- Check your homes for trip hazards. Some risks are obvious, but often overlooked, such as clutter or poor lighting.

Making small adjustments in your daily life doesn't mean that you have to limit your activities. In fact, it can give you greater freedom and confidence.

Rococo: A Masterpiece, Mystery and Madame de Pompadour This was the zoon lecture presented by Jacqui Ansell to Appleby Arts Society February meeting. In 18th century France a new Rococo style emerged which encompassed furniture, paintings, décor and fashion. Light and airy decorations inspired by nature were everywhere, around mirrors, clocks, on Sèvres china, small porcelain figures and in paintings. Jacqui told us how artists such as Boucher and Fragonard painted characters from Greek myths, with voluptuous goddesses draped in flowing, flimsy drapery and many attendant cherubs.

Born Jeanne Antoinette Poisson in 1721, the Marquise de Pompadour was a member of the French court, best known as Madame de Pompadour. She met King Louis XV at a masked ball at the Palace of Versailles and soon became his official mistress living in her own apartments in Versailles. She was a very beautiful and intelligent woman who set Paris styles for many years. Dolls were made wearing exact copies of her clothes and sent to England so that dressmakers could copy the French fashions. Pictures show that she was not only a beauty but had accomplishments — music, reading, letter writing, plays and novels. She was an adornment to the King's apartments.






