From the Vicarage

If all goes to plan, by the time you read this, it will be almost over! The pandemic won't be quite over, of course, but we are hoping at least for the end of Covid restrictions and the resumption of normal human interaction. Yet, paradoxically, this is also the time of the greatest danger. The danger is no longer clinical. It is a spiritual danger. We have vowed that the pandemic would change us, that we would learn the lessons and would not return to life as it was before. But the danger is that we forget all that as soon as it's over and slip back into the old ways, simply because they are familiar.

Back in October, Pope Francis wrote these insightful words in his letter to the world: "the brutal and unforeseen blow of this uncontrolled pandemic forced us to recover our concern for human beings, for everyone, rather than for the benefit of a few. Today we can recognise that we fed ourselves on dreams of splendour and grandeur, and ended up consuming distraction, insularity and solitude. We gorged ourselves on networking and lost the taste of fraternity. We looked for quick and safe results, only to find ourselves overwhelmed by impatience and anxiety. Prisoners of a virtual reality, we lost the taste and flavour of the truly real. The pain, uncertainty and fear, and the realisation of our own limitations, brought on by the pandemic have only made it all the more urgent that we rethink our styles of life, our relationships, the organisation of our societies and, above all, the meaning of our existence."

The searching truth of these words makes me long for change. So how might things be different? Instead of consuming endless products, experiences and travel opportunities, why not rediscover a sense of 'place' and build something together with our neighbours for the good of our fellow creatures? Instead of rushing from one experience to another, ending up exhausted, why not patiently learn a new skill until we master it? Instead of investing safely in an outcomes-driven world, why not risk a voyage of discovery and see where it takes you? For there are greater treasurers than can be measured by accountants, and life is often counterintuitive. Rather than indulging in a spirituality that turns us in on ourselves seeking personal wellbeing, why not discover the truth that we find our true selves in relationship, looking outward in selfless care for others? Instead of cherishing personal ambitions, why not help your community build some common dreams? All of this requires us to change the way we live. And that is only possible if we change what we believe and "rethink the meaning of our existence".

So to help the re-thinking process, I offer you some words of Jesus, so disorientating that they might just turn our lives around. "Those who try to make their life secure will lose it, but those who lose their life will find it." "Do not store up treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume, but store up treasures in heaven, for where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." "Do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? And can any of you add a single hour to your life by worrying? Instead seek God and do his will, and everything you truly need will be given to you." "Forgive others their trespasses. If you do not forgive others, neither will your heavenly Father forgive you." "You have received mercy, therefore be merciful." "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give rest to your souls." Let's not go back to normal after 21st June, but let's change and start living. Stewart



Take Positive Steps to Avoid Trips and Falls

People of all ages fall. However, the consequences of falling for older people can be serious. Falling due to aging is not inevitable, there are simple things we can do to minimize risk.

- Get regular exercise to improve strength, fitness and balance.
- Have your eyes and hearing checked. Vision and hearing play a vital role in balance and movement.
- Ask your pharmacist or GP for an annual medication review.
 Some medicines or illnesses, such as poorly controlled diabetes, can make you feel faint or dizzy.
- Look after your feet. Painful feet and ill-fitting shoes can affect your balance and increase the risk of falling.
- Make sure you get enough calcium and vitamin D to keep bones strong.
- Check your homes for trip hazards. Some risks are obvious, but often overlooked, such as clutter or poor lighting.

Making small adjustments in your daily life doesn't mean that you have to limit your activities. In fact, it can give you greater freedom and confidence.

When and where?



Early Christianity in Cumbria

Saint Ninian, born about AD 360, may have been of Cumbrian origin, although there is no evidence to confirm this: his major connection seems to have been with Whithorn in Galloway. The name of Ninian has strong associations with Ninekirks near Penrith. Not only did Ninian give his name to the place, he is believed by some to have had a hermitage in the caves of Isis Parlis overlooking the present church, which was originally dedicated to him. Earthworks in the area also give tantalising clues to an early monastery here. The other place in Cumbria that has associations with this saint is Brampton Old Church with its Ninewells and St. Martin's Oak locations. Both of these 'Celtic' sites, it has been pointed out, stood on the Cumbrian side of the boundary line of the Anglian Hexham diocese.


