From the Dicarage
At the end of the Second World War, when Allied troops walked into the Cologne concentration camp, they found these words written on a cell wall by an unknown inmate: "I believe in the sun, even when it is not shining. And I believe in love, even when there's no one there. And I believe in God, even when he is silent."

People often ask me how I can believe in a God of love in the face of so much suffering. I usually respond, "How can you face overwhelming suffering without God?" Is that not precisely the time when we need God? How else can there be hope? Richard Dawkins famously said. "The universe that we observe has precisely the properties we should expect if there is, at bottom, no design, no purpose, no evil, no good, nothing but pitiless indifference." But people of faith reply that we do not observe nothing but pitiless indifference in the universe. When we face the full force of sadness, evil and meaningless suffering, we observe love, somehow still intact. We see heaven groaning, we see God's outraged tears, we see Jesus on his cross, bearing the full force of the world's sin on himself, bearing agony and death, but not being defeated by it.

There is a reality and depth to our experience of love that transforms everything. Such love is not adequately explained by evolutionary advantage, selfish genes or chemical reactions. Love is so powerful that refuses to die. On the contrary, when it is outraged, it only grows stronger, turning into pain. Grief is proof that there is, at heart, no pitiless indifference, but only love. For Christians, that love exists because it is a reflection and a manifestation of the force behind all creation. "God is love", wrote St John, because at the heart of God is a relationship of perfect love between a Father, a Son and the Holy Spirit. That love compels him to care, inspires him to takes the full force of suffering upon itself, offers us healing and urges us to believe the promise of justice and redemption. Christians believe in suffering and we know that it can overwhelm us, but we also believe in something greater that will overcome everything that overcomes us. Those words in the cell in Cologne went on, "I believe, through any trial, there is always a way. Sometimes in this suffering and hopeless despair my heart cries for shelter, to know someone's there. But a voice rises within me, saying hold on my child, I'll give you strength. I'll give you hope. Just stay a little while."

The inmate of Cologne knew God before they were imprisoned. They had become accustomed to his voice and his ways, so that when he was obscured by suffering, they could know he was still there, just as though the sun had gone behind a cloud. There is no better way of facing the suffering that must inevitably come to us all than to prepare by getting to know God now, through worship, prayer, Bible study and fellowship with fellow believers. If we know his ways and trust his promises, we will know he is still there in the darkness. But even if we have not known him before suffering comes, we can trust to the love we have known, the sunshine we have felt and know that there is something greater than any suffering. We can reach out and know for ourselves the voice of the one who created us saying, "Hold on my child, I'll give you strength, I'll give you hope." I believe in the sun, even when it is not shining. And I believe in love, even when there's no one there. And I believe in God, even when he is silent. Stewart





Take Positive Steps to Avoid Trips and Falls

People of all ages fall. However, the consequences of falling for older people can be serious. Falling due to aging is not inevitable, there are simple things we can do to minimize risk.

- Get regular exercise to improve strength, fitness and balance.
- Have your eyes and hearing checked. Vision and hearing play a vital role in balance and movement.
- Ask your pharmacist or GP for an annual medication review. Some medicines or illnesses, such as poorly controlled diabetes, can make you feel faint or dizzy.

- Make sure you get enough calcium and vitamin D to keep bones strong.
- Check your homes for trip hazards. Some risks are obvious, but often overlooked, such as clutter or poor lighting.

Making small adjustments in your daily life doesn't mean that you have to limit your activities. In fact, it can give you greater freedom and confidence.

But we can still remember her in our own way through prayer, and memories and experiences we shared with her during her long and active life.


Daphne was a valued member of Bolton church and had a keen regard for everything going on in the village and surrounding areas.



Young Explorers Capture the Sound of the Westmorland Dales

Children from Crosby Ravensworth, Great Asby, Orton, Shap, Tebay and Kirkby Stephen Primary Schools have been working with Cumbrian sound artist, Dan Fox, to record pieces of music made entirely from natural sounds collected on a 'sound walk' around their villages.

The collection of short compositions include the sounds of flowing and bubbling streams, birdsong and echoes, the rush of the wind through the trees, the knocking of branches, the vibrations from the twanging of a fence and the voices of children taking part.

The 'Sound Explorer' project is one of many forming the Westmorland Dales Landscape Partnership Scheme, which has been funded by a grant from the National Lottery Heritage Fund with the aim to engage people in revealing, conserving, enjoying and sustaining the hidden heritage of the Westmorland Dales.

Class 2 pupils from Great Asby Primary School said:

"We learnt everything and anything can make sound. We were surprised at how quiet the garden ponds were and found twanging the metal fence really cool. Also, who knew that grass can talk!"

During this unique group experience, Dan used industry standard, battery-powered location sound recording equipment linked via a wireless transmitter to each child wearing wireless headphones. Different types of microphones were utilised to enable the group to listen to different aspects of the landscape. The sounds range from close-up sounds using hydrophones and contact microphones to a wider sonic image with boom microphones and a parabolic dish. The children's favourite sounds were recorded during the walk, edited and mixed back in the classroom to create unique and immersive sound compositions.

The project closed with an online conference between all six of the schools involved, where the children got the opportunity to introduce and share their musical creations with each other. Dan Fox was on hand to explain how the sounds in each piece were collected and how the children discovered the diversity of sounds.
