From the DicarageThis Christmas letter is my last letter as your vicar, as I prepare to move on in January after 11 years (almost 12!) There is also a strong possibility that the newsletter itself will come to an end in February after 25 years, as Sheila Clark steps down as editor with no replacement coming forward. The newsletter was launched at Christmas 1997 (initially serving Morland, Cliburn, Thrimby and Great Strickland) and I have a copy of every edition in my study. In the first ever letter, the then vicar, Revd Ken Cove, wrote that the most profound truths in life are often hidden in the most simple of places, like God himself appearing as a child. The simple is more remarkable than we assume. The basics matter. He said, "it is here, when we kneel before God and worship him, that we learn the basics of life on which the rest of our life is built."

That resonates for me as I think of you: my friends, the wonderful communities, the rhythm of life here and this beautiful place have all become very familiar to me. It is only now, as I prepare to leave, that I realise how much these simple everyday things matter. They are what my life is built on. I will miss you all more than I can sav. And likewise, the newsletter itself, popping through our doors with regular frequency for a quarter of a century can seem so routine, yet over the years it has put neighbours in touch with each other, promoted the work of honest, reliable local tradespeople, publicised local events and societies, and encouraged people in their daily lives with faith, hope and love. I would like to pay tribute to Sheila for her work as editor. Marion who has been the compositor and all who served before them. Their work has been hugely valuable and while I do not entirely lose hope that someone might emerge at the 11th hour to keep the newsletter going, if February's issue is to be the last, I believe it has made a truly valuable contribution as it has served a growing number of local communities.

Christmas shows that things don't have to last forever in order to be of value. Not only do babies grow up fast, but the particular baby whose birth we celebrate had death central to his purpose in life. Christmas comes to us as a season of great beauty and promise, the fragility of that baby showing us the gentleness and beauty of God. And it is surely our great tragedy that when our creator came to us, full of grace and truth, we could find no better response than to torture and execute him. Yet, in the face of our violence, he remained loving, to the point of being willing to give up everything. In his life, we learn everything about the love of God. His final words, "it is finished" were a defiant declaration that despite his brief life, including only three years' public ministry, his faithfulness and refusal to deviate from the path of grace and truth, whatever the cost, was sufficient to accomplish all that was necessary to save the world.

It is easy to think that in order to be of any value, we need to leave a legacy that outlives us, to allows us to get as close as we can to eternity. And yet the truth is that the closest we can get to eternity is in this little child, whose brief, but faithful life, brought heaven to earth and raised earth to heaven. In truth, we are not called to build things that last forever, we are not called to save the world, for the world already has a saviour. All we are called to do is to worship him and to build our lives with simplicity on his eternal truth and grace. So as I bid farewell. I thank you from my heart all for all your kindness and friendship. I will treasure the time we have shared and I leave you in the hands of a dear friend – Jesus himself - wishing you a very Happy Christmas. Stewart

Neighbourhood Development Plan

Footway Lighting

Regional funding and support for footway lighting in Eden has been withdrawn leaving Parish Councils to take on full responsibility by March 2022 for any lights we wish to retain. Recently lights mounted on private properties and North West Electricity poles have been removed, apparently due to safety issues with engineers at N.W.E, the power providers. All new replacement lights have to be LED in line with EU legislation and while the quality of the light emitted is debatable, the positive energy saving is a big benefit in today's environmental climate.

Street lighting is a complex issue that is made worse in a small village like ours with few footpaths or verges to place a light column, so we are reliant on the good will and co-operation of property owners to mount lights in the darkest key areas of the village.

The Parish Council thanks Mr & Mrs A Saggers, the Tuer family, the Markham family and the kind co-operation of Laura Ryan of Silver Birch shop, without your help the village would be a darker place. We will continue to do our best to respond to your concerns regarding footway lighting, so let any one of us know if you spot a problem. *P Hancock, Parish Councillor*

- Get regular exercise to improve strength, fitness and balance.
- Have your eyes and hearing checked. Vision and hearing play a vital role in balance and movement.
- Ask your pharmacist or GP for an annual medication review.
 Some medicines or illnesses, such as poorly controlled diabetes, can make you feel faint or dizzy.
- Look after your feet. Painful feet and ill-fitting shoes can affect your balance and increase the risk of falling.
- Make sure you get enough calcium and vitamin D to keep bones strong.
- Check your homes for trip hazards. Some risks are obvious, but often overlooked, such as clutter or poor lighting.




