

Hurd the Word

In our last edition of the NW News Sheila Clark our Curate reminded us that Lent was coming. That means Ash Wednesday will soon be upon us to mark the beginning of the Lent period. There will be a Joint Holy Communion service at St Peter's Askham at 7.30pm on Wednesday 2nd March.

For Christians it signifies an important event in our spiritual journey as we look towards Easter and the Risen Christ, which allows us to reflect on our relationship with God and those who walk alongside us.

In the bible readings on Sundays in church that take us through Lent, we are initially reminded of Jesus' time spent in the desert preparing for his brief three-year ministry with his disciples and followers. In the reading for the first Sunday of Lent, Luke 4: 1-13, we see that Jesus will not be diverted from the mission and purpose that God has entrusted to him, to bring Good News as the Angels sang to humankind when his birth is announced, even though he is sorely tempted. This is the inspiration for us to make an extra effort, to set aside either in the weekly Lent group, or at another suitable time, opportunity to read the scriptures, pray and meet with others.

If we're able to do this it can be an enriching experience where we can go deeper into our faith and allow the Holy Spirit to bless and encourage us, both individually and together There will be LENT Groups taking place throughout the North Westmorland Area at various venues and these will be publicised nearer the time.

To help us through the Lent groups we will be taking a look at the Archbishop of York, Stephen Cottrell's book 'The things he carried - A journey to the Cross: Meditations for Lent and Holy week.' I am certain we will find it beneficial.

In coming together in this way, we strengthen our faith and I believe that then can enable ourselves to be beacons of light and hope in a world that is often dark and difficult. As I write this leader for the NW News, the forces of Russia and Ukraine are still at a standoff, which I pray will be resolved through diplomacy and not force. Not least because UK armed forces may also be involved in some way via NATO. One of the disciplines of Lent is to pray and I invite you to continue to pray for that situation, and also if you feel so inclined for Nazanin Zaghari-Ratcliffe and her family here in the UK, who is imprisoned in Iran since 2016, for what in reality is a debt that is owed to Iran by the UK for a previous arms deal. If you do not know the detail please look it up on the BBC website. I believe it is time for this situation to end and a family to be reunited.

Finally, I hope that you will be able to join us at one of those groups as we pray, study, and have fellowship together. Contact Sheila Clark, Sandy Pearl, or David Jones if you are interested.

<u>Parish Council update</u> - The Parish Council held a meeting on January 10th, where it was agreed to object to a planning application at Morland House (21/1001), on the grounds of highways issues and local planning policy.

<u>Neighbourhood</u> <u>Development Plan</u> – We are currently finalising details on community assets. The District and County Councils are compiling a Local Heritage List to help protect items of local interest across Cumbria. <u>Wild flower area at the Village Hall</u> - Over recent years we have been trying to convert the overgrown area by the Village Hall into a wild flower area and viable habitat for wildlife. The ongoing progress continues with the imminent planting of yellow rattle plants as it is hoped these will help control the strong cocksfoot and rye grasses that dominate and restrict the establishment of the wild flower seeds and plants.

As in previous years the area was cut and cleared in autumn after seeds have been shed, this allows plants to self-seed for next season and for rigorous re-growth of established plants, it also reduces competition for the new wild flower seeds applied each year of which over 20 different species have been sown to date.

The area behind the maze path provides winter cover for wildlife, and is not normally cut and cleared until spring before the new growth of the Meadow Sweet and Pink Campion can once again provide a scented display of colour and pollen for the insects. This area is used by Hedgehogs, field mice and voles, partridge, foxes, even orange toads, as well as a variety birds and insects feeding on the nectar and seeds.

We hope you enjoy this patch and please let us know if you see any unusual wildlife. Councillor Phill Hancock





Take Positive Steps to Avoid Trips and Falls

People of all ages fall. However, the consequences of falling for older people can be serious. Falling due to aging is not inevitable, there are simple things we can do to minimize risk.

- Get regular exercise to improve strength, fitness and balance.
- Have your eyes and hearing checked. Vision and hearing play a vital role in balance and movement.
- Ask your pharmacist or GP for an annual medication review.
 Some medicines or illnesses, such as poorly controlled diabetes, can make you feel faint or dizzy.
- Look after your feet. Painful feet and ill-fitting shoes can affect your balance and increase the risk of falling.
- Make sure you get enough calcium and vitamin D to keep bones strong.
- Check your homes for trip hazards. Some risks are obvious, but often overlooked, such as clutter or poor lighting.

Making small adjustments in your daily life doesn't mean that you have to limit your activities. In fact, it can give you greater freedom and confidence.
