

From Crosbar House

At the time I am writing this, the world is in turmoil. The fragile peace that we have enjoyed ever since the 'Cold War' thawed is now threatened. Mikhail Gorbachev, together with US President Ronald Reagan, embarked on summits to limit nuclear weapons. He also declined to intervene militarily when various Eastern Bloc countries abandoned Marxist—Leninist governance in 1989–1990. At this moment, the freedom from Soviet rule for Ukraine is in jeopardy and it is not easy to look forward to the Spiritual freedom of Easter.

As we have begun to feel that the impact of Covid upon our freedoms is lifting with a degree of normality and less anxiety returning, we should now consider the plight of those whose country is being attacked on many fronts. Peace and normality are far from their current plight. However, diplomats and politicians are now working to bring about a peaceful resolution for the Ukraine and other countries where armed conflict continues to rage. We must see what we can do in our small but not insignificant ways to help and support those who are suffering. As Christians, we can and must always pray for those who are suffering in any way and for those working to reduce the misery of those caught up in warfare on either side. Meanwhile there are many groups who are collecting and transporting items that will ease the plight of the refugees.

Now our Lenten journey has begun; some will have chosen to sacrifice some well-loved habit, food or drink for the duration. As Alun suggested last month, I would also encourage you to take up an extra and positive discipline, such as spending more time with God in prayer, reading the scriptures or joining a Lent study group. If you are a beginner in such activities, do ask for help, we've all had to begin at some time, whether long past or more recently. Any attempt you make will be rewarded as you grow to know yourself better in the love of God.

As Jesus spent time in the desert, we too may feel ourselves to be in our own often self-made wilderness. We may be tempted to give up on our chosen Lenten sacrifice and discipline. Try to remember how Jesus rebuffed the temptations that he faced with words from the Hebrew scriptures. You can then seek help and forgiveness from God for our human weaknesses. He understands and is full of compassion and mercy for us always ready to welcome us back into His fold.



People of all ages fall. However, the consequences of falling for older people can be serious. Falling due to aging is not inevitable, there are simple things we can do to minimize risk.

- Get regular exercise to improve strength, fitness and balance.
- Have your eyes and hearing checked. Vision and hearing play a vital role in balance and movement.
- Ask your pharmacist or GP for an annual medication review.
 Some medicines or illnesses, such as poorly controlled diabetes, can make you feel faint or dizzy.
- Look after your feet. Painful feet and ill-fitting shoes can affect your balance and increase the risk of falling.
- Make sure you get enough calcium and vitamin D to keep bones strong.
- Check your homes for trip hazards. Some risks are obvious, but often overlooked, such as clutter or poor lighting.

Making small adjustments in your daily life doesn't mean that you have to limit your activities. In fact, it can give you greater freedom and confidence.
