Morland PCC Platinum Jubilee project:

Morland Church Flagpole


Do you miss seeing the St George's flag as you come into Morland?

The flagpole at the top of the church tower snapped through a bolt hole during Storm Desmond (2015). Rot had penetrated the wood and had made the pole weak.

We would like to replace the flagpole to commemorate Queen Elizabeth's platinum jubilee and have a flag flying again by the 2nd of June 2022.

A bespoke wooden pole has been commissioned from G&S Specialist Timber, Stainton to match the old one. The total cost of the project will be around £2000.

We are inviting people to contribute to this cost. Contributions (if wished) will be recognised in a book displayed in the church.



Take Positive Steps to Avoid Trips and Falls

People of all ages fall. However, the consequences of falling for older people can be serious. Falling due to aging is not inevitable, there are simple things we can do to minimize risk.

- Get regular exercise to improve strength, fitness and balance.
- Have your eyes and hearing checked. Vision and hearing play a vital role in balance and movement.
- Ask your pharmacist or GP for an annual medication review.
 Some medicines or illnesses, such as poorly controlled diabetes, can make you feel faint or dizzy.
- Look after your feet. Painful feet and ill-fitting shoes can affect your balance and increase the risk of falling.
- Make sure you get enough calcium and vitamin D to keep bones strong.
- Check your homes for trip hazards. Some risks are obvious, but often overlooked, such as clutter or poor lighting.

Making small adjustments in your daily life doesn't mean that you have to limit your activities. In fact, it can give you greater freedom and confidence.







ABOUT A CENTURY SINCE.....

The weather was mostly fine and warm, after a long cold spring. There were "few swallows this year", according to 'The Herald'. Here is more of the news of a century ago in our area, paraphrased in places to make it more interesting to the modern reader! (Me taking liberties: Ed.)

Mr Frederick Clarke was ford Lonsdale's Head Gardener until his retirement to Penrith at 9 Brunswick Square. 7 1/2 years later, he died at the age of 81, having been married for 50 years. His wife had died in December, 1921. Mr Clarke fell ill soon after having two operations (a major undertaking in those days: Ed.), and was found at Lowther, with his second wife, on Saturday 23rd June. One of his three daughters was Lord Lonsdale's private secretary.

The Rev. A-J. Heelis, Rector of Brougham, resigned, being too ill to run the parish. St Andrew's, Penrith covered Ninekirks for him and Clikfton's priest covered St Wilfrid's Chapel. The next Rector of Brougham would be the Rev. C. H. Eckersley, how at Temple Sowerby. 'Silverpen', the Editor of The Herald at the time, said they should abolish the tiny parish and give Ninekirks to Temple Sowerby, and St. Wilfrid's to Clifton. Thankfully, his opinion was not heeded!

Crosby Ravensworth Girl Guides Concert and Dance was held on Friday, 26^{th} May, in the Maulds Meaburn Institute, and made £17 (which would be c. £1,360 in 2022: Ed.)

There were speed trials in Lowther Park for the Westmorland Motor Cycle Club on Saturday 27^{th} May, which was an annual event. The half-mile course was run in fine weather in Mitchell Holme, from Low Gardens Bridge to the ex-Yeomanry Camp Officers' Mess. There were no mishaps (although in other years, there were several accidents: Ed.).

Miss E. Pallister, a teacher at Crosby Ravensworth School, passed the Royal Horticultural Society exam for certification as a Teacher of Gardening.

Teacher: What does your Mother say to your Father when he gives her
