From Crosbar House

May is, for many of us, a month of hope. For farmers and gardeners, the hard work of autumn, winter and early spring is reaping its rewards as lambs and calves thrive on the spring grass in the fields; the milk yields also benefit from the farmer's good husbandry as do the crops in the fields. Gardeners too will be enjoying visions of their garden blossoming, spring bulbs being replaced by early summer bedding plants and vegetable seeds germinating with the promise of delicious additions to their diets in the months to come enjoying the fruits of their labours.

Last month we celebrated the great festival of Easter and this month we look forward to Ascension day, May 26th, and Pentecost, June 5th, two important dates in the church's calendar. For Christians, hope is central to our lives and it is something sure and reliable. St Paul said that hope was "the assurance of things not seen" and that it is one of the three things that would endure eternally (along with faith and love). The assurance of endurance is what Christian hope is all about.

Rather like the gardeners' seedlings, we can be assured of hope because of Jesus' resurrection. Because God became a human being, lived our lives, disposed of the sins that kill us and rose to life again, he demonstrates the lifecycle of the Christian – a lifecycle that moves from the bleakness of sin to the radiance of heaven. Rather, like the weather, God may move in mysterious ways, but there is a pattern to what he is doing which gives us a firm ground for hope.

We can be assured because we know that Jesus lived on this earth. His existence was affirmed by a Jewish historian, Josephus, who was opposed to the early Christian movement.so that much is beyond doubt, and we have become convinced that he was God incarnate and that he rose from the dead. Not just a wild dream or wishful thinking, but a reality.

Perhaps for you that reality is as hard to imagine as summer warmth is from the dark days of January. But the summer warmth was as much of a reality in January as it is in May. What helps us make the transition from cynicism to hope is our faith in the historical Jesus and our relationship with him. Rather like our seedlings, hope in Jesus is something that needs to be nourished every day — watering them with prayer and God's word, looking for green shoots of spiritual life and following where God's light leads. Then we too will be ready for the garden — God's garden — where we will enjoy the fruit of our labours and nothing will be sweeter than that happy day when our hope is fulfilled and we will be with our creator father God in the closest possible loving relationship for ever.



Morland PCC Platinum Jubilee project:

Morland Church Flagpole

Do you miss seeing the St George's flag as you come into Morland?

The flagpole at the top of the church tower snapped through a bolt hole during Storm Desmond (2015). Rot had penetrated the wood and had made the pole weak.

We would like to replace the flagpole to commemorate Queen Elizabeth's platinum jubilee and have a flag flying again by the 2nd of June 2022.

A bespoke wooden pole has been commissioned from G&S Specialist Timber Stainton to match the old one. The total cost of the project will be around £2000.



Take Positive Steps to Avoid Trips and Falls

People of all ages fall. However, the consequences of falling for older people can be serious. Falling due to aging is not inevitable, there are simple things we can do to minimize risk.

- Get regular exercise to improve strength, fitness and balance.
- Have your eyes and hearing checked. Vision and hearing play a vital role in balance and movement.
- Ask your pharmacist or GP for an annual medication review.
 Some medicines or illnesses, such as poorly controlled diabetes, can make you feel faint or dizzy.
- Look after your feet. Painful feet and ill-fitting shoes can affect your balance and increase the risk of falling.
- Make sure you get enough calcium and vitamin D to keep bones strong.
- Check your homes for trip hazards. Some risks are obvious, but often overlooked, such as clutter or poor lighting.

Making small adjustments in your daily life doesn't mean that you have to limit your activities. In fact, it can give you greater freedom and confidence.





A MAY DAY LEGEND


It was on May Day that Queen Heurodis, wife of King Orfeo, dozed off beneath a grafted apple tree (in Celtic Mythology, a tree to which faeries are particularly attached). As she slept, she was whisked away for a guided tour of the land within the hollow hills, and in her dream the King of the Faeries promised that during the next night he would enter her realm and take Heurodis into his world forever.

The Queen told her husband about her strange experience. Next evening, Orfeo posted soldiers everywhere, but it was to no avail; the King of the Faeries appeared and vanished with Heurodis before a sword could be unsheathed. Orfeo was tormented by his queen's disappearance. He left his kingdom in the care of a regent, took his harp, and went into the wilderness. For ten years he wandered, looking everywhere but finding nothing. Finally, hairy and sickly and close to starvation, he collapsed on a riverbank. As Orfeo lay there, a group of a thousand faerie knights passed by. Travelling with them, still clearly spellbound, was Heurodis. Spurred by the sight of his queen, Orfeo summoned the strength to follow, and he was able to pursue the knights as they rode through a cleft in a nearby rock face.

Orfeo found himself in the faerie kingdom. He managed to get an audience with the King, and stunned the entire court with his exquisite harp playing. The King was so impressed that he granted Orfeo anything he desired. Orfeo chose Heurodis, but the Faerie King faltered, saying that it would be a shame to give a beautiful woman to a hideous harpist. Orfeo pointed out that it was a greater crime for a king to renege on his word. So Orfeo took Heurodis back home, had a shave, relieved the regent; and they ruled happily ever after.

This tale comes from the Middle English poem 'Sir Orfeo', a 14th Century adaptation of the Greek myth of Orpheus and Eurydice.

THE LAST WORD...

A few people have asked me why we have what seems to be a very early cut-off date for advertising. I can well understand that a cut off that is only a few days after release of the latest Newsletter might seem a bit 'mean' if people don't know what is going on behind the scenes. Here's a very brief summary of things from this end, as I've found it so far.

Generally, by the first of the month, there is not very much input in the way of articles. Sheila used to send an email out to remind people that the closing date was approaching, and I have maintained this good practice. The nudge usually generates one or two submissions fairly quickly, followed by several that arrive on 7th in time to hit the cut off date (and sometimes some risk-takers submit after this date!).

By 7th, I have made a draft copy of the Newsletter, based on the latest issue, and gone through removing out of date items and changing dates &c. We have a wonderful team of behind the scenes helpers who do all the hard word of delivery and keeping track of paid adverts, and I get information from them promptly as to what adverts to remove, what errors I made in the previous issue, how many copies are needed, &c. &c.

Now the Newsletter is converted to PDF and sent to the publisher. It is ready for collection a week later, and is collected and distributed to be delivered to homes over the following week. I send out digital copies at the end of the month and then start again on the next issue. The first week of the month receiving submissions, the second week putting the publication together, the third for the printing and the fourth for delivery. Not a huge amount of leeway for late submissions! So, by the time you read this, I shall be working on June's issue.

Huge thanks to our team for keeping me on track, or I'd never be able to get it out on time!
