At the time of writing, early September, the season is already beginning to change, the nights are drawing in and there are signs that we are moving into the 'Season of mists and mellow fruitfulness' as Keats so eloquently described autumn, or Backend as it is known locally. Children have returned to their classrooms and university students will soon be setting off to their colleges. By the time this is printed or emailed to your inbox the changes will be more permanent. Despite the effects of climate change, the seasonal pattern remains constant as our planet continues its journey around the sun.

There is another change taking place in our world as I write, nothing to do with the season, the television, radio and all news media are full of tributes to our late and beloved Queen Elizabeth II who has died so recently; "A life well lived". There is much history and ritual before our eyes as our late Queen is taken to places where many can pay their respects. I am frequently distracted by this and by my wish to witness the many events, full of elaborate language, tradition and pageantry, through which Prince Charles has had to transition immediately into King Charles III. He has put aside personal grief and taken up the duties required at the beginning of his reign with energy and dedication. I am fascinated by the way the ceremonies of centuries past, previously private and hidden from public view are now openly broadcast. The historical traditions are still at the root of our unique constitution and still belong to and uphold the modern governments of our nations and Commonwealth.

I find a parallel to this in Christianity; where would our faith be if we didn't have the Old Testament to lead us into the New? Jesus lived the traditions of that old covenant although he put aside many of the manmade laws which countered his understanding of God's purposes. He attended Synagogue worship regularly where he would have heard and read the books of the Old Testament possibly intoning or singing the psalms. He lived out and fulfilled the prophesies and so our modern faith in Jesus has its foundations in them.



Morland House is a former Tudor vicarage lived in by the Markham family since 1828. The four acres of magical gardens reflect the changing tastes of successive generations. Described as 'a hidden secret in the heart of the tranquil Eden Valley' (Tim Longville, Cumbria Life) the first impression is one of extensive lawns, colourful herbaceous borders and walled rose garden with views to the Pennines. Then comes the surprise.







A flight of stone steps leads down to a lower garden laid out around Morland Beck fed by a high 'force' gushing water into a shady pool below. Crossing the beck by the wooden foot bridge, visitors reach a secret wonderland where nature runs riot – a Victorian rock garden created out of a former quarry complete with fountain, grotto and cliff top walk towering overhead. The circular walk returns via the steppingstones and Lion Steps to the croquet lawns. Starting with snowdrops and aconites in January and February, there are extensive daffodils in March and tulips in April and May. June is the month for the rose garden, and the herbaceous borders flourish from July to October. The garden trail will keep all ages entertained.



To round off the visit, the Millyard Café is open for light lunches and teas. Closed on Mondays and Tuesdays.

Morland Church is open every day and has the only Saxon Tower in north-west England.

Getting there

Morland is in Cumbria's Eden Valley which divides the Lake District from the Pennines. The village is at the centre of a triangle made by Penrith (8 miles), Appleby (7 miles) and Shap (7 miles) and is easily accessible from the M6 and A66. Morland House is in the heart of the village with the front gates and driveway leading from the village square. The postcode is ${\bf CA10~3AZ}$

Take Positive Steps to Avoid Trips and Falls

People of all ages fall. However, the consequences of falling for older people can be serious. Falling due to aging is not inevitable, there are simple things we can do to minimize risk.

- Get regular exercise to improve strength, fitness and balance.
- Have your eyes and hearing checked. Vision and hearing play a vital role in balance and movement.
- Ask your pharmacist or GP for an annual medication review.
 Some medicines or illnesses, such as poorly controlled diabetes, can make you feel faint or dizzy.
- Look after your feet. Painful feet and ill-fitting shoes can affect your balance and increase the risk of falling.
- Make sure you get enough calcium and vitamin D to keep bones strong.
- Check your homes for trip hazards. Some risks are obvious, but often overlooked, such as clutter or poor lighting.

Making small adjustments in your daily life doesn't mean that you have to limit your activities. In fact, it can give you greater freedom and confidence.

If you do have a fall or feel at risk of one, tell your GP

The walk begins in Kirkby Stephen and we leave the town, crossing the Eden by way of Frank's Bridge. The river bank is followed to Pod Gill and then a nice woodland section can be enjoyed before bridging the river again and entering Stenkrith Park, a perfect spot for our picnic lunch.

The Westmorland Dales is bounded on all sides by major through-routes - the Lune gap; the Eden valley and east to west through Ravenstonedale to Kirkby Stephen. In between there are miles of lanes and paths. For thousands of years, people and their animals have used these ways through the landscape and they have all left their mark. The 'A Way Through' project aims to explore the history of these routes and of the people who travelled them and to share their stories with the wider public.

Shap is one of the villages the project has been investigating. The arrival of the M6 removed all but local traffic from the village. Before then, the A6 was a major north-south route, mostly following the line of the eighteenth century turnpike to Kendal and beyond. These roads brought money and jobs to the village as did the Lancaster and Carlisle Railway line opened in 1846. But Shap has a much older history of travel and the prosperity it brings. This exhibition at the Old Courthouse will explore some of these fascinating stories from the Neolithic to the Victorian era...

We will also be showing pencil artwork by local artist, James Dean, an employee of the Westmorland Services that will include images he created to celebrate the 50th anniversary.

The 'A Way Through' project is run by the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority, funded by the Westmorland Dales Landscape Partnership Scheme, jointly led by the Friends of the Lake District and the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority. The scheme was grant funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund.

A Message from The Bishop of Cartisle The Right Reverend James Newcome

God for All Vision Refresh - Roadshows

As we write to you, so our country continues to come to terms with the death of our dear Late Queen whilst equally reaching out in love and support to our new monarch, King Charles III. Our prayers remain with the Royal Family, and we also give thanks for all you are doing in the support of your communities at this time.

Whilst these are difficult days, we know that Her Majesty, whose reign was undergirded by such a strong faith, would want us all to continue to work to strengthen God's Kingdom. It is with this in mind that we write to you today with news of six forthcoming God for All roadshows.

You will be aware that in 2019 all four ecumenical leaders committed to a refresh of the county's God for All vision. Obviously, as with so much of our day-to-day life, the coronavirus pandemic had a significant impact on timelines around work on the refreshed vision. Indeed, as lockdowns came and went so the decision was taken that we needed time to pause, reflect and pray about the next steps for the refresh process. Following that reflective time, work has now moved on apace once again and I'm delighted to say that all four leaders have endorsed important component strategies which will see an outworking of that refreshed vision. With this in mind, Bishop Rob and I are very keen to keep people updated as to the latest developments and to encourage further feedback and discussion.







ABOUT A CENTURY SINCE.....

From "The Herald" Oct.. 1922

Weather was fine, cold and windy with autumn colours showing best on 8th October.

29th September, Gunnerwell's granary caught fire, with much hay in it. The tenant, Mr R. Coatesworth, saw it at 5 p.m. and sent for the Penrith Fire Brigade who came quickly, but their engine sank in the muddy lane down to the farm and they were short of water. The livestock were all saved, but the crop and implements were burnt, with a total loss of £15,000 (over £947,000 today) which was only partly insured. The owner was Mr. Thomas Wilkinson. The cause of the fire was likely to be spontaneous combustion, caused when hay which is too damp is stored in a barn, or if newly cut hay is stacked too close together without room for air to circulate and complete the drying process. As mentioned last month, the haying had been very wet this year, so getting the crop in would have been difficult.

Mr. Henry E. Atkinson of Morland Hall, whose engagement was announced last month, wed the Lady Eleanor Byng in London and honey-mooned in Gloucestershire. Mr. Atkinson gave a dinner for his tenants, wives and friends in the Kings Arms, Morland, where a toast was given to the happy couple by Mr. John Chester, the oldest tenant.

Lady Lonsdale re-opened Penrith Cottage Hospital on 4th October to serve the Eden Valley. The hospital had been upgraded and extended.

The West Ward RDC voted to bridge the ford at Bysteads, but not the one at Newby End, which was not well enough used.

Bolton's Young Helpers League held a Coffee and Cake Sale for Dr. Barna-do's Homes which made £10 (modern equivalent £800).

Harry Byers lived with his parents at Lankaber. Thomas Mavis, a rabbit catcher, also lived there at this time. He took Harry with him to shoot or catch rabbits at Sockenber on 23rd October. Harry put his gun, loaded and ready, on the ground, but it slipped and went off, shooting him in the stomach. "What happened Harry?" "It slipped." Soon, Harry was asking for his mother. He died 90 minutes later. Harry hads enlisted in the Great War when under age, had lost an eye, and was shot in the leg.

It would be remiss of me to allow this edition to go to press without making a comment about the recent passing away of Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II. I was shocked to read a comment on the Internet asking why such a fuss was being made about her death, because she had never worked a day in her life. How dreadfully ill-informed some people are! This was a woman who had spent over 70 years of her life being in the public eye. Not for her going home at 5 or 6 in the evening to a night with the family or popping out for a night of fun. Her hours started early and ended late, with endless public functions where she had to entertain people who may well have been uninteresting; always on display; always having to say and do the right thing; always having to look interested and happy. No skipping off work if she didn't feel quite right, or had a headache, or just fancied a 'sickie'. Her Majesty had only two days totally free from work each year, Christmas Day and Easter Day, those two Christian Holy Days, were the only days when she didn't have a 'Red Box' of documents to peruse, consider and sign. Even when on holiday with her family, she undertook that task. In the Second World War, she served her country in active service as so many women of the time did, wanting to 'do her bit' for her country. Her whole life was constrained by her belief that it was her duty to serve her country. I cannot believe that anyone, no matter what their opinions on Monarchy might be, could have anything other than respect for her. Never worked?
