From Crosbar House

It is the beginning of November as I write and already my TV and radio are telling me that Christmas is on its way. The advertisements are all trying to persuade me that their products are the ones to buy, hoping that I shall spend my money on their merchandise in the shops this year. That is the commercial voice of Christmas speaking.

Christmas is a time of hope for many. Our children especially, are full of hope that they will receive the presents they crave. I expect that this year most parents are hoping that the cost of living will not climb any higher as we approach the festive period.

For a Christian, Christmas holds a story that is full of hope and there will be many chances for us to rejoice together in faith and safety this year. All are welcome to join us as we gather to sing carols, light our Christingles, collect round the cribs and above all to celebrate Midnight Mass or Christmas morning Eucharist in our churches as we thank and praise God for the amazing and perfect gift in the birth of Jesus.

How can a baby be the answer to the world's problems? A baby may symbolise a fresh start, a new generation and if we look at our progress in terms of worldly wealth, medical advances or technological prowess, we might think there is reason to be more hopeful with each passing generation. But we also see a world that is peopled by a humanity that still has a terrible capacity for inhumanity and which appears hell-bent on destroying the planet which sustains us. What can a helpless baby do against such a powerful tide of fear and destruction? And if our personal experience is anything to go by, is not a baby, for all its innocence and potential, simply destined to repeat the same mistakes we have all made and will make?

Surely, if our loving Father God the omniscient, wanted to save the world with a grand plan, he could just wave his all-powerful arms and sort out all our problems for us.. Does that sound like the mission for a baby? A major problem is that our grand plans focus on the big picture at the expense of the individual. Individual needs, ancient ways, local traditions all have had to give way to the greater good of the grand plan. To achieve this, we need centralised power, vested in an individual or a single party. This inevitably tramples on freewill of the individual. God's way is very different. Throughout history, he steadfastly refused to be a tyrant and refused to withdraw the gift of freewill from his creation. He values each human life, respects each human decision, for better or worse, and uses his mighty power only when we let him. That means that his way of saving the world starts with each of of us and needs us to play our part.

Thinking of hope leads me to rejoice that our prayers have been answered with the appointment of Reverend Stephen Tudway to be our Priest in charge. He, his wife Charlotte and family will be moving into Morland vicarage in early January. He will be licensed on the evening of January 5th 2023, time and venue to be arranged, and will take up his ministry with us from January 15th. onward. From then, he hopes to make his way around our churches, now including Shap and Bampton, and to meet as many of us as possible. There may be other opportunities to meet him and his family other than in church. Keep your ear to the ground for news. Morland Beck Pollution - If you see any evidence of pollution of our waterways, caused primarily by the Morland sewage treatment plant, please contact the Environment Agency on 0800 80 70 60

Following recent reports of pollution in the rivers of the Eden valley, and Morland Beck in particular, the Parish Council has been in contact with the environment agency, our local MP and United Utilities to ascertain what actions will be taken to alleviate the problem. It has been accepted by the Environment Agency that the sewage treatment plant in Morland is highly likely to be contributing to the problem.

In order to build their case, the Environment Agency has asked that any members of the public who witness any form of pollution entering the local waterways contact them as soon as possible. If you have any concerns about the colour or smell of the Beck, or see any other evidence of pollution, please contact the Environment Agency on 0800 80 70 60. This number is available 24/7 and any concerns will be immediately assessed.

<u>Highways and Maintenance</u> – Issues regarding road maintenance, including potholes, flooding, and verges, are currently dealt with by Cumbria County Council. To report any concerns, please contact the Parish Clerk as below, who will contact the County Council on your behalf. Morland Posada 2022

Posada is the Mexican tradition of people dressing up as Mary and Joseph and going from house to house to tell about Jesus and the Christmas story. Our parish Posada is a much simpler tradition and one in which it is easy for you to participate.

We have a knitted nativity scene which appears gradually in church, throughout Advent. At the same time the figures of Mary and Joseph will travel around the parish staying in people's homes for one night. Their journey will begin at the Family Advent Service on Sunday 27th November, 11 o'clock at St Lawrence Morland and end when the last family on the list brings them to our Crib Service on Christmas Eve at 5 o'clock.

If you would like to give Mary and Joseph lodgings for a night during Advent, please contact me and I will put you on the list. The people bringing Mary and Joseph to you will read out a simple giving prayer, then there is an equally simple receiving prayer to be read out. There is also a journey blanket with marked out blank squares - one for each day of their journey - for each host to decorate with words and/or pictures to show how Mary and Joseph spent their Posada time with you. This lovely tradition is open to all families in our parish and school. Please contact whomever you will be passing Mary and Joseph to agree hand-over arrangements.

I will also make up a few Posada bags (as we had over the past couple of years) to post to anyone out of the area who would like to participate. Packs will be delivered the week before Advent. Each pack will have a date on it. That will be the date that the pack should be opened. Each pack will contain a laminated picture of Mary and Joseph to hang-up in your home and a couple of prayers; a prayer for others, especially those in the Posada chain before and after you, and a prayer for your household. There will also be a blank paper square to decorate, telling in either words or a picture, about Mary and Joseph's Posada day with you. I will put any decorated squares returned to me up in church alongside our journey blanket.

Take Positive Steps to Avoid Trips and Falls

People of all ages fall. However, the consequences of falling for older people can be serious. Falling due to aging is not inevitable, there are simple things we can do to minimize risk.

- Get regular exercise to improve strength, fitness and balance.
- Have your eyes and hearing checked. Vision and hearing play a vital role in balance and movement.
- Ask your pharmacist or GP for an annual medication review.
 Some medicines or illnesses, such as poorly controlled diabetes, can make you feel faint or dizzy.
- Look after your feet. Painful feet and ill-fitting shoes can affect your balance and increase the risk of falling.
- Make sure you get enough calcium and vitamin D to keep bones strong.
- Check your homes for trip hazards. Some risks are obvious, but often overlooked, such as clutter or poor lighting.

Making small adjustments in your daily life doesn't mean that you have to limit your activities. In fact, it can give you greater freedom and confidence.



Morland Mothers Union Open Meeting

Our Open meeting on Thursday 27th October in the village hall was certainly a successful one. We were lucky to have Andy Airey, of "3 Dads Walking Fame" to speak to our members and guests. Margaret Gore welcomed members and guests. Over 60 people were present, including our own members as well as other MU members from Bolton, Asby and Shap. There were also some WI members, a group of friends from Penrith Methodist Church and others from Morland and nearby villages.

Andy, who was then introduced by Margaret, gave a moving and inspiring talk about how his life had changed since losing his daughter, Sophie, to suicide almost 4 years ago. To help cope with his grief, he began by running marathons and getting involved with other fundraising events. His main motive was to raise awareness of suicide in young people and also raise money for Papyrus, Prevention of young Suicide. This is the charity which helped Andy and his family after their loss.

Eventually, by chance Andy met up with Mike and Tim who had also lost their daughters to suicide. They soon planned their first walk of over 300 miles between their homes, in 2021. This is when they became the "3 Dads Walking". They were featured on BBC Breakfast and Look North, giving them celebrity status! All the money they raised went to Papyrus.

Walking and talking helped Andy, Tim and Mike with their grief, so another walk of 600 miles was planned for 2022. This time they walked between all the UK Parliaments, raising even more money for Papyrus. During the walk, the total amount passed the £1 million mark. In fact, on the last day they were given a Just Giving award for Fundraising Team of the Year. A few days before Andy's talk, the 3 Dads had been at the Pride of Britain Awards where they received a Special Recognition Award. Coverage of their walks was again featured on television, their current aim being to get suicide prevention included in the National Curriculum.

Despite the subject matter being both serious and sad, Andy managed to tell his moving story in such a way that his audience were gripped from beginning to end. A number of slides illustrated the talk and Andy also played the soundtrack of a folk song called "3 Dads Walking" written specially for them by The Young Uns. This had a catchy tune and very apt lyrics. After the talk, Andy answered a few questions from the audience, and the vote of thanks was given by Ann Baxter.

Many members worked hard to make the Open meeting a great occasion. A raffle was organised and refreshments included homemade cakes with tea or coffee. Also very popular and much appreciated was ice cream which Claire Bland from Abbott Hall Farm brought along. There was no charge for this but donations went to Papyrus.

When all the proceeds from the meeting had been put together, we were able to give Andy a cheque to the value of £570 for Papyrus.
