From the Vicarage

Hello, I am the new Church of England minister for North Westmorland, an area embracing Shap, Bampton, Askham, Lowther, Brougham, Clifton and Brougham, Cliburn, Bolton, Morland and Crosby Ravensworth (with apologies to the churches and localities within that circle that I haven't mentioned – you are not forgotten!). I am also acting as Rural Dean, with responsibility for Appleby Deanery, including Appleby itself, and the wider area down to Brough, Kirkby Stephen, Orton and Tebay. I hope you will excuse me using this month's article just to introduce myself and my family.

I have come here from the south west of the County, around the top of the Duddon Estuary. I had responsibility for seven churches there, and for a year I was also the interim Methodist Minister. I have moved with my wife, Charlotte, and daughter Anna, who is on a gap year before university. We have a son, William, who lives in Hertfordshire in one of our former parishes. He works as a planter, machine operator and HGV driver for a large tree nursery.

Charlotte and I met at university, where we both studied law. Charlotte practised as a solicitor before leaving work to look after our two children. I was a barrister for 20 years, first in independent practice and then helping to set up a London litigation practice for a US law firm. In my early days, I practised in charity, company and insolvency law, but gradually moved into commercial IT, construction and technology projects, including spacecraft (not as exciting as it sounds, unfortunately). In my spare time, I enjoy fiddling with my trusty Land Rover, which has been with me for nearly 15 years now, and is back from the dead, having been written off by a careless motorist while parked during my ordination service.

I gradually reduced the amount of legal work I was doing, to give me more time for church commitments. After completing my ministerial training, I was curate of two rural parishes in Hertfordshire. Having worn many volunteer hats, I never forget that the life of any community (the church included) depends upon the time and efforts of its unpaid army of volunteers.

Charlotte retrained as a primary school teacher when our daughter started school. She was headteacher of a small school in Hertfordshire, and is now Director of Education for the Diocese of Carlisle, supporting our family of 104 church schools. I have been involved in church and community school governance, from pre-school to Key Stage 5, for about 16 years now, so I look forward to helping all the schools in my new patch, as well as getting involved in youth work.

With such a large area to cover, it is impossible for the vicar to do everything, or even to know everything that he or she ought to be doing. I am hugely blessed to have the support (and to support in my turn) a large team of ministers and other volunteers across all our churches. Please do not hesitate to get in touch, for any reason, using the contact details below. I hope over time to get to know, and to be of service, to everyone, churchgoer or not. Please stop me in the street, outside school, in the shops or in the pub and introduce yourself. You will recognise me when I am dressed in black with a funny collar, but I am the vicar in my shorts and t-shirt too.

March 4th Southport. The Victorian seaside resort with quality shops and a pier almost 1 mile in length.

Take Positive Steps to Avoid Trips and Falls

People of all ages fall. However, the consequences of falling for older people can be serious. Falling due to aging is not inevitable, there are simple things we can do to minimize risk.

- Get regular exercise to improve strength, fitness and balance.
- Have your eyes and hearing checked. Vision and hearing play a vital role in balance and movement.
- Ask your pharmacist or GP for an annual medication review.
 Some medicines or illnesses, such as poorly controlled diabetes, can make you feel faint or dizzy.
- Look after your feet. Painful feet and ill-fitting shoes can affect your balance and increase the risk of falling.
- Make sure you get enough calcium and vitamin D to keep bones strong.
- Check your homes for trip hazards. Some risks are obvious, but often overlooked, such as clutter or poor lighting.


Making small adjustments in your daily life doesn't mean that you have to limit your activities. In fact, it can give you greater freedom and confidence.

<u>Morland Beck Pollution</u> - If you see any evidence of pollution of our waterways, caused primarily by the Morland sewage treatment plant, please contact the Environment Agency on **0800 80 70 60**

Following recent reports of pollution in the rivers of the Eden valley, and Morland Beck in particular, the Parish Council has been in contact with the environment agency, our local MP and United Utilities to ascertain what actions will be taken to alleviate the problem. It has been accepted by the Environment Agency that the sewage treatment plant in Morland is highly likely to be contributing to the problem.

<u>In order to</u> build their case, the Environment Agency has asked that any members of the public who witness any form of pollution entering the local waterways contact them as soon as possible. If you have any concerns about the colour or smell of the Beck, or see any other evidence of pollution, please contact the Environment Agency on 0800 80 70 60. This number is available 24/7 and any concerns will be immediately assessed.

<u>Highways and Maintenance</u> – Issues regarding road maintenance, including potholes, flooding, and verges, are currently dealt with by Cumbria County Council. To report any concerns, please contact the Parish Clerk as below, who will contact the County Council on your behalf. 





ABOUT A CENTURY SINCE.....

From "The Herald" Jan/Feb 1923

Average weather, but stormy in mid-February.....

Bolton Church Hall opened on the evening of January 4^{th} , which was thanks to an idea from and organisation by the vicar.

Sleagill Footbridge in Reagill will be getting a handrail for safety and the road outside Bolton School will be getting a 'Danger' sign erected.


In late January, Bolton W.J. had its 1st A.G.M.


