

From the Vicarage

In recent weeks, the publication of Alatt Hancock's WhatsApp messages by the Daily Telegraph has forced us to relive some of the politics of 2020. It's not a time which many of us want to revisit, but that hasn't prevented the scandal from selling newspapers and generating endless commentary. How like human beings! For reasons of political expediency, we have not yet conducted an official exercise in learning the important lessons of that time, and yet here we are, raking over the minutiae of one aspect, in the full glare of publicity.

Three years ago, we were afraid, because we faced the unknown. In late Alarch 2020, I had a telephone conversation with a friend in his mid-90s (whose funeral I was unable to attend later that year, due to restrictions). He enumerated all the 'bad times' through which he had lived: the Second World War; flu pandemics in 1957 and 1968; the snowbound winter of 1962/3; the Cuban Alissile Crisis; the oil crisis; the drought of 1976 and the Winter of Discontent. The worst, he thought, depended upon who you asked: how they were individually affected. We were surprised at how many 'bad times' he could name. We might have felt differently about the 1980s, he said, if we had lived in a mining community. Looking back, "none of these things was the end of the world," said my friend, "although I was afraid that some of them might be, at the time." Bad times are personal. For some of us, 2020 was the worst of times. For others, different years have brought worse.

Easter in the Gospels captures this fear. Three women approach the tomb of Jesus, their spiritual leader, who has been horribly put to death two days earlier. All that he promised seems to have come to nothing. As they reach the tomb, they are horrified to find that it has been desecrated. The heavy stone used to close the entrance has been removed. A mysterious stranger, sitting by the entrance, tells them, "he has been raised; he is not here ... go, tell his disciples."

We retell the Easter story as one of hope, but Alark's Gospel (unlike the other three) seems to have ended with these words: "Trembling and bewildered, the women went out and fled from the tomb. They said nothing to anyone, because they were afraid." The Gospel message is not that everything will be rosy. It is a message of hope told in the face of real fear, real grief and real suffering. The Bible does not pretend that the world can easily be made a perfect place.

for most of us, in this fortunate society, reality is ordinarily benign. It comes as a shock whenever that benevolence is temporarily suspended. But there is plenty to make us anxious; to fear being afraid. Like my friend looking back, even the very worst times eventually acquire a perspective. Fear and grief are natural, but let us pray for release from anxiety.

Bad times are also testing times. We find afresh our capacity to give and (importantly) receive help. Adversity, and the necessity it creates, can be the mother of invention: "look how many technologies advanced during the Second World War," observed my triend.

Despite the everyday expression, these things are not sent to try us, whether by God or anyone else. It would be wonderful, it might even be better, if there were no bad times. But we know that they have come; they will come again. The answers are faith and hope: faith in God, in each other and in the fact that we are "fearfully and wonderfully made", with the capacity to overcome our troubles. The hope of the Gospel is that we will one day look back together, from the perspective of eternity.

April 1st. A visit to Lakeland Ltd. the retail outlet at Windermere followed by a drive through the Ambleside and Grasmere areas to Keswick where there is a Saturday market, or perhaps a walk to Friars Crag with the outstanding views across Derwentwater down the Borrowdale valley.

May 13th Beetham Nursery nr.Milnthorpe followed by a visit to Sizergh Castle, managed by the National Trust and still the home of the Strickland family. A house visit is optional but there are lovely gardens to walk round with a shop and tearoom available.

Take Positive Steps to Avoid Trips and Falls

People of all ages fall. However, the consequences of falling for older people can be serious. Falling due to aging is not inevitable, there are simple things we can do to minimize risk.

- Get regular exercise to improve strength, fitness and balance.
- Have your eyes and hearing checked. Vision and hearing play a vital role in balance and movement.
- Ask your pharmacist or GP for an annual medication review.
 Some medicines or illnesses, such as poorly controlled diabetes, can make you feel faint or dizzy.
- Look after your feet. Painful feet and ill-fitting shoes can affect your balance and increase the risk of falling.
- Make sure you get enough calcium and vitamin D to keep bones strong.
- Check your homes for trip hazards. Some risks are obvious, but often overlooked, such as clutter or poor lighting.

Making small adjustments in your daily life doesn't mean that you have to limit your activities. In fact, it can give you greater freedom and confidence.

If you do have a fall or feel at risk of one, tell your GP

PLAY BRASS IN EDEN

- a project supported by Eden District Council





In the "Brass in Eden" project, Drum and Brass is working with four local bands in Eden: <u>Appleby Town Band</u>, <u>Kirkby Stephen Silver Band</u>, Melody Makers - Tebay and <u>Penrith Town Band</u> as well as music organisations including <u>Bjamba Horns</u> and bands elsewhere in Cumbria to secure the future of brass bands in our community.

With a grant of £8,750.00 from the Eden District Council's Arts and Culture Development Fund the "Play Brass in Eden" team _ Julie Hoggarth, Jenny Bowes and Kath Wignall are touring schools in the area with their hands-on brass taster sessions. In these sessions, young people get to play along with the "band" and find out how they can take up playing. It's not only young people however, who can get involved in the joys of

It's not only young people however, who can get involved in the joys of banding. There are also groups for adult beginners and nearly every band will welcome new players with open arms and a cuppa.

The project organiser Drum and Brass sees brass bands as central to community life. For communities, brass bands mark the seasons with music and are a must-have for e.g. Christmas Carol events and Summer Fetes.

For musicians they represent an affordable and sociable way to learn a musical instrument and they are open to all ages. And despite the many challenges of covid and cuts in music education, bands are thriving. Eden has three established bands, which meet weekly in Penrith, Appleby and Kirby Stephen, while three new brass groups between Tebay and Kirkby Stephen with collectively 30 members show there is real interest in learning.

ABOUT A CENTURY SINCE.....

From "The Herald" April 1923

Cold Easterlies and all month. Blizzard on 24th.

Bolton Memorial Hall's Fancy Dress Ball on Thursday, 5^{th} made over £200 (around £16,000 today's value!). It was opened by the M.P.'s wife.

Mrs Anne Egglestone, wife of Joseph, farmer, died on Good Friday aged 72, a hard working, capable lady who helped run the farm as her husband was a railwayman at Great Strickland when she married him. She was from Blencarn and they farmed at Great Strickland, Gamblesby and Kirkoswald. Joseph was also the carrier to Penrith and had retired two years before to their son Willan's farm at Croft House, Cliburn, which is where Anne died.

Lowther W.Q.'s subject for April was 'Raffia Work' and they met in the Board Room, Hackthorpe.

There was a thunderstorm at Clifton on Thursday 12th April and a concert was hel d in the Reading Room on Thursday 17th in aid of Clifton Wesleyan Chapel's repairs.

Crosby Ravensworth Parish Council's annual meeting was held on Mo, nday 16th and gave grazing rights to Messrs A. & J. Furness. The decrepit footbridge near Bridge Hoiuse, Maulds Meaburn was to be rebuilt and a site visit was made to view the river bank at Maulds Meaburn school, which was undercut.


A taxi driver from Grange-Over-Sands collided with a motorbike and flattened 36 feet of Lowther Bridge's wall. The County sued for its cost, £129, and the court fined him £15 for the accident. The motor-cyclist was badly hurt,.


