

From the Vicarage

Easter, and the school holidays, now seem rather distant, but in church it's still the Easter Season. We're still reflecting on how the Easter story speaks to us today.

On Easter Sunday we read one of the first Christian sermons, given by the Apostle Peter in the house of the Centurion, Cornelius. Peter begins by recalling Jesus' life and ministry ("he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed") and then tells the Easter story of death and resurrection. He concludes by summarising the task that Jesus left for his church to continue: "preach to the people and testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead" (Acts 10:34-43).

In the modern world we've come to be suspicious of 'preaching' and 'judgement' – sometimes wisely. But what Peter is saying is that Christians should tell people that Jesus will judge. People, who are imperfect, should not judge. Judgment is reserved to God, who Christians believe to be the definition of the perfect and good. The people who will be judged favourably by God, according to Peter, are not holy people, but people of "every nation" who "do what is right" (Acts 10:35).

A God who judges implies that there is be justice. And a God of justice, who went about on earth healing the oppressed and commanding us to do as he did, is interested in securing justice in this world. Justice in the face of war, persecution, poverty, grief and much else. In her work in education, my wife talks about the difference between equity and equality. Imagine three children – tall, middle and short – straining to watch a football match over a fence. The tall child can see over the fence; the middle child can do so only uncomfortably, by standing on tiptoe; the short child cannot see at all. Imagine that we give all three a small crate to stand on. They have all been treated equally. The crate is just the right size to let the middle child see comfortably. Unfortunately, it still isn't enough for the smallest child to see. And it gives the tall child enough of a leg-up to get over the fence and climb into the ground without paying!

We instinctively know that this isn't the right way of fixing the world's problems. The tallest child needs no help. The small box will be enough for the middle child, but the smallest child needs more help – an extra large crate to stand on. This is *equity*. Treating everyone *justly*, according to their circumstances. Instead of allocating resources equally, or to the people we prefer, we give each what is required to ensure a just outcome.

The social systems and the economies of the world have long failed to provide everyone with either the same resources, or equality of opportunity. Things tend to be skewed towards the interests of the people who already have something: not even because they are most powerful and misuse that power, but because they have been in a position to decide how things are done, and have understandably chosen what suits people in their shoes. It's why we don't often hear about the biggest economies and companies, or the wealthiest individuals, failing: things tend to be set up for their convenience, rather than the convenience of the poor.

Jesus came into the world to call our attention to God's idea of justice. This is not about punishing people for private, petty 'sins', but ensuring that everyone can have "*life in all its fulness*" (John 10:10). Furthering that aim is what Peter means by "doing what is right."

IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR ALL READERS AND ADVERTISERS

The North Westmorland News is catching up with the times we live in! The June issue will be the last hard-copy edition available generally. Many people already get it by email, and it is also available on the website. Those who wish to receive a hard copy will be able to do so via their local Parochial Church Council. Everybody will be able to ask to have it as a pdf by email. At first, there will be no change in the format, but no doubt as we go on, the opportunity will be taken to update that. In particular, we will be able to use colour at no cost. (Hard copies would probably be in black and white.

We are making this change as part of the zero-carbon policy, and to save paper. We will also save our churches a lot of money. In 2022 the total cost of printing the magazine was £10,500, and we collected £4,500 for advertisements. That left a deficit of £6,000 to come out of our shared benefice expenses. Compared with pre-Covid, printing costs have risen substantially and advertising revenue has fallen. The deficit that had to be covered in 2019 was £2,500 – and that was already on a rising trajectory.

Those who have paid for advertisements in future months will be offered a refund, and in due course a new scheme for advertisements will be publicised.

Our Newsletter goes back, in one form or another, to the early 1970s. It began as a single sheet of foolscap (remember that?), posted through all the letterboxes in the parishes. From that day to this, an army of volunteers has edited and distributed it around our ever-expanding patch. We are immensely grateful for all the work that has gone into it. And in its new incarnation it will still need an editor, so thanks again to all the successive editors, but specially to the present one, Alex Paris.

Take Positive Steps to Avoid Trips and Falls

People of all ages fall. However, the consequences of falling for older people can be serious. Falling due to aging is not inevitable, there are simple things we can do to minimize risk.

- Get regular exercise to improve strength, fitness and balance.
- Have your eyes and hearing checked. Vision and hearing play a vital role in balance and movement.
- Ask your pharmacist or GP for an annual medication review.
 Some medicines or illnesses, such as poorly controlled diabetes, can make you feel faint or dizzy.
- Look after your feet. Painful feet and ill-fitting shoes can affect your balance and increase the risk of falling.
- Make sure you get enough calcium and vitamin D to keep bones strong.
- Check your homes for trip hazards. Some risks are obvious, but often overlooked, such as clutter or poor lighting.

Making small adjustments in your daily life doesn't mean that you have to limit your activities. In fact, it can give you greater freedom and confidence.

The new unitary authority of Westmorland and Furness will fulfil the functions of both County and District authorities. The new authority is aiming to ensure continuity of front-line services, to progress a smooth transition.

In the "Brass in Eden" project, Drum and Brass is working with four local bands in Eden: <u>Appleby Town Band</u>, <u>Kirkby Stephen Silver Band</u>, Melody Makers - Tebay and <u>Penrith Town Band</u> as well as music organisations including <u>Bjamba Horns</u> and bands elsewhere in Cumbria to secure the future of brass bands in our community.

With a grant of £8,750.00 from the Eden District Council's Arts and Culture Development Fund the "Play Brass in Eden" team _ Julie Hoggarth, Jenny Bowes and Kath Wignall are touring schools in the area with their hands-on brass taster sessions. In these sessions, young people get to play along with the "band" and find out how they can take up playing. It's not only young people however, who can get involved in the joys of

It's not only young people however, who can get involved in the joys of banding. There are also groups for adult beginners and nearly every band will welcome new players with open arms and a cuppa.

The project organiser Drum and Brass sees brass bands as central to community life. For communities, brass bands mark the seasons with music and are a must-have for e.g. Christmas Carol events and Summer Fetes.

For musicians they represent an affordable and sociable way to learn a musical instrument and they are open to all ages. And despite the many challenges of covid and cuts in music education, bands are thriving. Eden has three established bands, which meet weekly in Penrith, Appleby and Kirby Stephen, while three new brass groups between Tebay and Kirkby Stephen with collectively 30 members show there is real interest in learning.




